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DPHSS Guidance Memorandum 2020-11 Rev 11 (Amendment 2)

RE: Acceptance of Immunization Records Between the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands and Guam as Proof of COVID-19 Vaccination

The Guam Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) Commonwealth Healthcare Corporation (CHC) mutually agree to accept official immunization records as proof of COVID-19 vaccination for passengers seeking exemption from quarantine upon arrival in Guam; and for those entering CNMI, these official immunization records represent one component of the requirements to be eligible for no quarantine. Individuals are considered fully vaccinated 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, or 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine.


Passengers arriving into Guam, who were fully vaccinated in the CNMI, are to present their photo identification (e.g. passport, driver's license, state-issued identification) along with their CNMI Immunization Registry Official Immunization Record upon arrival into Guam. Individuals presenting their CNMI Immunization Registry Official Immunization Record upon arrival may be exempt from quarantine.

All passengers traveling to the CNMI must complete the health declaration form online (<https://governor.gov.mp/covid-19/travel/>) prior to arrival. Passengers who are fully vaccinated in Guam, are encouraged to submit their online application at least 72 hours prior to arrival and through this application upload their Lifetime Guam Immunization Record WebIZ form. For passengers who complete the health declaration form less than 72 hours before arrival or onsite, will be processed in the order their application was received.

This agreement shall enter into effect on May 27, 2021 and shall remain in effect until (1) the expiration of the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency, or (2) the DPHSS Director or the CHCC Chief Executive Officer rescinds or modifies this order based on specific public health or other considerations.
